POINTS OF INTEREST:

- 1. EH SNG Grants have reduced due to changes to eligibility criteria.
- 4. 71% of Horowhenua ED Admissions are our community aged 55 and over.
- 2. Local beneficiary numbers have increased by 3.5% since September 2024.
- 5. Residents aged 55-64 years make up the largest age group in Horowhenua, accounting for a combined 21.6% of the total population.
- 3. Horowhenua's NEET rate ranking sits among the bottom seven territorial authorities in New Zealand.
- 6. All crimes show a decrease or no change, with robbery only slightly up by 5.








Local: At the end of December 2024, 4,407 people were receiving a main benefit, which is up by 150 from the last report in September 2024. This equates to an increase of 3.5%.
