


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
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Community feedback demographics of respondents


Respondents by gender




Age of respondents

Ethnicity of respondents



While the majority supported the vision statement, we found that some feedback provided ideas on how to refine this and make it better to reflect the uniqueness of Foxton and Foxton Beach, so we have updated the Vision Statement to reflect these comments and suggestions.

Additional comments made that helped shape the new vision statement:

"A thriving Te Awahou Foxton where our history is honoured, people and culture are celebrated and natural surroundings are proudly treasured by all that live, work and play here"

"Agree with emphasis on environment and character, suggest stronger emphasis also on "and one another" e.g. the safety, health and happiness (or wellbeing) of one another....."

"I think we need more than 'recognition of culture.' We should extend slightly further than that to amplify, champion, and embrace our local cultures being Māori and Dutch. There is minimal done to showcase the uniqueness of Foxton and the ways in which residents and visitors can contribute."


"I feel that this vision is too narrow to encapsulate all the key themes of the plan to date. It should also mention the history and culture of Te Awahou, Foxton. Perhaps something along the lines of: Our vision is a thriving Te Awahou (Foxton) where our history is honoured, culture is celebrated, and natural surroundings are treasured by residents, businesses, stakeholders, and visitors."


The majority of feedback supported the key themes and vision statements, however minor changes were made to reflect comments made in regards to community, tourism, business, recreation and roading opportunities.

The majority supported the suggestion of a group being established that was made up of community members who could help to develop, communicate and oversee the plan.

Additional comments to consider with the delivery approach

The following comments were made that were not in favour of the proposed approach, and may need to be considered when communicating how the group will be created and run:

"Absolute crap we have a community board, is that not their job, you charge us on our rates for them"

"How does the general community get their wants and needs across vs just the group of representatives pushing their agenda."

"All good except that the process did not include the Manawatu Estuary Management Team in its consultation. MEMT is in the final stages of preparing a Manawatu Estuary Management Plan and was unaware of this plan. It is important that the two Management plans are consistent with each other."

"This approach will create a set of silos within the community. We need cohesion and a working group mobilised key areas of Foxton. There are already comments circulating that Foxton does not have a clear and cohesive voice - why create a response that further encourages this approach? If that is not the case, more clarity on the approach needs to be communicated."

Notable feedback specific to Commercial and Tourism

"Foxton is such a dreary place, it's awful that Foxton on SH1 is so run down, it gives the rest of Foxton a bad look."

"It would be good to utilise parks more (e.g. one in Foxton Beach) such as for a local Saturday or Sunday market - such as they have in Ōtaki and other places. Would attract those potentially from Palmy or Levin with produce to sell as well as those selling craft goods. Could have a community working group involved in the setup of this..."

"We need more carparking and public toilets. support from council instead of red tape when we try and do things like Xmas parades, fireworks, etc. There is no mention of the largest tourism attraction in town the Windmill. We need to better help them improve and offer the best experience we can as a town and a council. we need council to lobby NZTA on our behalf for some kind of roundabout maybe to get people off the main highway into the township and beach thank you"

Notable feedback specific to Transport and Infrastructure

Taking feedback in regards to making the enabling actions broader, we recommend that the following enabling actions become projects that should sit within the plan specifically:

· Identify enhancements and improvements that could be made to increase the safety for all road users

"Get rid of all the open stormwater drains, including better drainage to eliminate flooding."

"Please can we have a roundabout at the intersection at Norbiton/Robinson/SH1 (it's all the Foxton Beach traffic) and another at Union Street if enough in the coffers. It is getting increasingly difficult to get across SH1 and it's only going to get worse. It will make such a big difference to Foxtonians."

"Why is there no mention of public transport provision? The Beach is very disconnected to Foxton and further, unless you have a car. The negligible service we have is utterly woeful."

Notable feedback specific to Recreation

Taking feedback in regards to making the enabling actions broader, we recommend that the following enabling actions become projects that should sit within the plan specifically:

- Repurpose the old outdoor pool space for other recreational activities e.g. ice-skating rink, netball courts, hockey etc
- · Develop a mountain biking facility that attracts visitors, events and families
- Develop link with Palmerston North and Foxton Rail Trail

"Create a safe place for children and adults to ride their horses along trails"

"We should be upgrading the recreational facilities we already have"

"Recreational horse riders need to be specifically invited to the table to help make decisions re recreation and acceptance."

"Ensure that Horse Riders are secured access to areas where they can ride safely through multi use accessways and a secure site for their activities."

"Equestrians are a valid and viable part of our paying community, we are people who pay rates and make a contribution - we are widely supported in other area Councils but not yours - a region that is renowned for horse riding and events - farming in general. Please respect this and give us back our riding terrain. Thank you in advance."

"The exclusion of horses from all public areas discriminates against a large number of rural ratepayers and significantly reduces tourism opportunities for horse riders to come in to the Horowhenua to enjoy the environment and spend on services and facilities as they do so. They will simply go where they are welcome and the considerable financial benefits of having a healthy equestrian base in the area will be lost."

"Cycle trails are taking over & horse riding has been totally ignored"

"There is no provision for safe places for people to ride horses, and the roads, especially around town, are not very safe for cyclists either - all the islands are hard to navigate if there is a lot of traffic there is nowhere for bikes to go other than footpath. The lack of safe passage across the bridge to get to Levin is very sad. Horses and their people need to be given shared access to existing trails, and considered when new cycle ways are made for the new highway - shared pathways as exist in other districts are needed. At present horse riders are forced into a dangerous position of having to share the roads with increased traffic as they have been shut out of the places they used to frequent - and with more out of town people coming, there is much less awareness of how to drive considerately around horses."
