8 Announcements

Mayor Duffy acknowledged the passing of Mr George Paton who was a well-known and regular attendee at Council meetings. Our condolences and thoughts are with Mrs Christina Paton.

Property and Parks Presentation

Mrs Marjo Crueldad and Ms Kim d'Auriol, Facilities Maintenance Team, presented on the benefits, cost savings and added customer value with regard to facilities maintenance contract changes. A saving of \$250k per year has been the result of changes to both planned and reactive contract work in relation to Council owned buildings and community facilities.

The Mayor congratulated the team on changes implemented to improve service delivery and savings to Council.

As signalled, Report 15/776 Construction Contract for Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom Project was the next item addressed.

11.1 Construction Contract for Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom Project

Purpose

The purpose of this report is for Horowhenua District Council to consider recommendations for the appointment of the main contractor for the Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom project.

MOVED by Cr Bishop, seconded Cr Brannigan:

THAT Report 15/776 Construction Contract for Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom Project be received.

THAT this decision is recognised as significant in terms of S76 of the Local Government Act.

CARRIED

Mr Peter Kemp, Principal, Coley Street School, spoke about the huge emphasis within the Te Awahou Learning and Change Network, on raising student achievement in particular for priority learners. There is a focus on developing parent partnerships, students learning from students and learning for the modern world. Foxton needs modern learning environments available outside of school hours where there is access to digital technology. Speaking on behalf of the community including Foxton Beach, they believe that Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom will help sustain progress with not only priority learners, but all learners.

Oliver Easton from Coley Street School would like to see a bigger library, an arts and cultural centre and a place that shows the history of Foxton.

Mr Bill Huzziff asked Council to consider the plan for the Foxton Memorial Hall and Courthouse Museum prior to making a decision about proceeding with the Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom project. Further, Mr Huzziff stated that proceeding with the project is a major departure from the long term plan and should be consulted on.

Mrs Ann Thomas expressed her concerns regarding the Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom project due to the Dutch community not contributing as much as initially stated and there being an apparent shortfall of funding. A simple library upgrade appears to have expanded to a multi-party complex. Mrs Thomas would like Councillors to consider the additional debt that ratepayers will be taking on and what effect will this have on rates and on generations going forward.

The next speaker introduced was Ms Awhina Tamarapa, Cultural Consultant and member of the Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom Project Steering Group representing Te Taitoa Māori o Te Awahou. Ms Tamarapa spoke about the point of difference that Te Awahou will provide, the cultural significance and the innovative approach to the project across multiple cultures. Ms Tamarapa added that museums have the ability to change people's lives through connection to one's origins, arts and culture.

Mrs Anne Hunt has been a supporter of the concept for some time and is pleased to see it progress to this stage. Mrs Hunt commended Rodney Caldow Builders as exceptional builders. Mrs Hunt expressed concern that the Mitre 10 Building extends onto Māori land and would like to see this sorted prior to building commencing. Mrs Hunt would like to know that ongoing operating costs and any shortfall is covered. She would also like clarification around the Dutch 'in-kind' contribution, and how the administration and operation of the facility would work.

Mr Ben Vanderkolk was welcomed to the table representing the Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom Trust as the current Chairperson. Mr Vanderkolk talked about Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom as being 'our place', a place for all to gather and reflect on their history. He acknowledged the commitment of Ngāti Raukawa and the community. The project has received endorsement from the Embassy of the Kingdom of Netherlands. Mr Vanderkolk informed that the Trust Board will define its role over time to suit the project and thanked those who have contributed to the project.

Hannah Street, Massey University student and former Manawatu College student, spoke about Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom being a magnificent facility for the Foxton community. She informed that many students travelled to Levin to use the Te Takere facility. There is nowhere for students to go to after school for Foxton and Foxton Beach students. Kyle Williams-Simeon, current Head Boy from Manawatu College spoke about the potential benefits for the community in terms of education for all students.

Mr Bruce McIntyre, Principal, Manawatu College, added that young people of Foxton and Foxton Beach need access to a facility such as Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom to use digital devices and have access to the internet. He feels that both primary schools and the college will make use of the facility during school hours. Looking at Te Takere, people are overwhelmed with the usage, Mr McIntyre can see the same usage of Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom.

Mrs Janine Smart sees Te Awahou as a once in a generation opportunity for the community to enhance social, cultural and environmental interaction. It will host the National Dutch Museum and house Māori art work. The Friends of Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom Group was formed recently with the purpose of raising funds for the project.

Mrs Cathy McCartney, Strategic Project Coordinator, joined the table. Mrs McCartney informed of a correction to point No. 5.5 in the report, which states there are two

phases, this should say that there are three phases. Mrs McCartney spoke about the funding applications successful to date and funding applications under consideration. Mrs McCartney clarified 'in-kind' donations and how this is recorded on the budget.

Mr Clapperton clarified several points following on from speakers:

- In response to Mr Huzziff - there are several buildings within the district that Council needs to consider as they have been deemed 'earthquake prone buildings'
- There is not an expectation that all of the funding is secured prior to commencement of the project, as with Te Takeretanga o Kurahaupō
- A strict procurement process is followed with all contracts undertaken by Council, this includes discussions with Caldow Builders
- A Community Services Review is currently underway which includes libraries and community centres. There is an expectation that there will be no additional rates revenue required for these community services
- Ms Hēni Collins from the Cook Whānau, was welcomed to the table to explain the agreement with regard to the piece of land (whenua) owned by the Cook Whānau which is under the Mitre 10 building. Ms Collins explained that Council has agreed to sponsor an artwork to be created by a member of the whānau, to be part of the Piriharakeke Gallery & Museum Project
- It was mentioned by Mr Bill Huzziff that proceeding underfunded with the project would be a departure from the Long Term Plan. Mr Clapperton responded by saying that if there was a significant shortfall then there is an opportunity to reduce the scale of project

Mayor Duffy acknowledged Council Funding Manager, Mr Peter Leach, in securing funding for this project. This is revenue for a project that will benefit the entire community which has been quite a challenge to raise. This is Mr Leach's last day with Council.

Mr Pete Bosley, architect from Auckland, was also acknowledged for his contribution to the project. Mr Bosley was thanked for his vision he has captured and presented for Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom.

MOVED by Cr Bishop, seconded Cr Brannigan:

THAT the Horowhenua District Council undertakes the redevelopment of Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom as a managed contract.

THAT Council authorises the Projects Committee and the CEO to negotiate a managed contract for the construction of Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom with Caldow Builders Ltd to +/- 10%.

9 Notices of Motion

9.1 Reinstatement of Council Building Access - Crs Campbell and Feyen

In accordance with Standing Order 3.10, Crs Feyen and Campbell submitted the following Notice of Motion for consideration at the Council meeting being held on Wednesday 2 March 2016.

MOVED by Cr Bishop, seconded Cr Mitchell:

THAT Report 16/87 Reinstatement of Council Building Access - Crs Campbell and Feyen be received.

CARRIED

Point of Order: Cr Rush reminded the meeting that speaking rights had been granted, Upheld.

Mrs Toms spoke in support of the recommendation to reinstate Council building access for Crs Campbell and Feyen.

Mr Cyril Andrews joined the table providing an explanation as to why he entered the basement area with Cr Campbell in 2015 prior to Crs Feyen and Campbell's restricted building access being actioned. Mr Andrews stated that he has concerns in regard to the integrity of the building following viewing cracks in the basement. Mr Andrews asked if the building has a Code of Compliance or Building Warrant of Fitness as he understands that it hasn't, and further asked if a Structural Engineer will be brought in to assess the building. Mr Andrews sought clarification around 2.1 in the report, asking if structural issues were confirmed in the Opus report. The Chief Executive informed that this part of the notice of motion was written by Crs Feyen and Campbell – these are their words not a Council Officer's.

Amendment

Cr Feyen requested to change the motion as follows:

THAT a full independent enquiry is ordered by Horowhenua District Council, into the withdrawal of Cr Feyen's and Cr Campbell's access cards to the HDC building.

The Chief Executive clarified that a notice of motion may only be altered by the mover with the consent of the meeting (Standing Orders 3.10.4 Alteration of notice of motion).

This was put to the vote:

LOST

The original Notice of Motion recommendation stands.

Crs Feyen and Campbell spoke in support of their Notice of Motion. This was followed by an opportunity for the Chief Executive to respond.

Mr Clapperton introduced Mr Manos Bairaktaris, M.Eng, CPEng, Chartered Professional Engineer, Director of ISPS Consulting Engineers who undertook an assessment of the structural condition of the Council building. Mr Bairaktaris' credentials were provided as a handout to the meeting.

Mr Bairaktaris explained the process for assessing the building's structural integrity. This entailed an inspection of the building, a review of the structural documentation and the report on structural performance (Opus International Consultants 'Detailed Seismic Report'). Mr Bairaktaris informed that their findings agree with the Opus Report and that the building remains a safe building for normal occupancy.

Mr Bairaktaris informed that cracks were observed which do not appear to pose any danger, they are within the limits defined in the Building Act. These are mainly the result of concrete shrinkage due to the 73.6m dimension of the floor slab. A recommendation will be made on how to treat these cracks.

The Chief Executive provided copies of the Building Warrant of Fitness and Code Compliance Certificate. Mr Clapperton addressed the meeting explaining that an independent engineer's report was commissioned due to ongoing allegations from Crs Feyen and Campbell questioning the structural integrity of the HDC building. Despite three requests for documented evidence to support these allegations, there was no information forthcoming. As a result of Crs Feyen and Campbell entering the Council building carpark in 2015 to take video footage of what they reported to be cracks affecting the structural integrity of the building, and using this video footage to scaremonger, the privilege of Councillor building access was restricted to entry via the front entrance and entry to the Ante Room.

In summary, the Chief Executive informed that his reasons for restricting Cr Feyen's and Cr Campbell's building access still stood.

Due to comments made by Cr Campbell with regard to the Chief Executive, Cr Campbell was issued a warning from the Mayor. A warning was also issued to Cr Feyen for comments made during this item.

Crs Feyen and Campbell exited the meeting at 8:01 pm. This followed several warnings to Cr Campbell who was asked to leave the meeting by the Mayor for comments made to a Councillor whilst speaking. Cr Feyen chose to leave at the same time.

Although the mover and seconder exited the meeting, the motion was put.

MOVED by Cr Feyen, seconded Cr Campbell:

THAT Council instructs the Chief Executive to reinstate access to the Council building for Councillors Feyen and Campbell.

LOST

Deputy Mayor Good requested that some type of censure be explored into the behaviour of Crs Feyen and Campbell over the last few months and in particular tonight.

MOVED by Cr Good, seconded Cr Bishop:

THAT the Chief Executive prepare a report for the next Council meeting with regard to the behaviour of Crs Feyen and Campbell.
