## Chief Executive's Report to 21 November 2016

### 1. Purpose

To present to the Foxton Community Board, for information, issues relating to the Foxton Community Board area.

#### 2. Recommendation

#### 3. Issues for Consideration

#### 3.1 Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom Update

There will be an update on the Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom project from Cathy McCartney.

#### 3.2 **Foxton Pool Update**

Council officers have engaged structural and mechanical engineers to provide a report on condensation and overheating issues at Foxton pool. This report has been received and remedial work has begun which includes; retreating and providing a protectant to structural timbers, replacement of the extract fan with a passive ventilator, the installation of spot cooling fans and the potential instillation of internal shading. The invasive part of these works will all be complete in time for Foxton Pool to open on 1 December 2016.

A supplementary report, to be received soon will outline the potential long term options for a year round operation as well as detailing potential costs involved. This will form part of a report for Council to review early in the New Year so that a year round operation can be discussed.

A schedule of Programmes and Events has been planned for the upcoming season at Foxton Pool. This includes, but is not limited to the below:

- Dec: Foxton crash swim course
- Dec: Foxton Schools out Pool party
- Feb: 'Aging well' Wellness week (LAC)
- · Feb: Term 1 lessons at Foxton and Levin.
- March: Foxton Agua Event
- April: World health day promotion.

#### 3.3 Foxton Beach Public Reserves Draft Plan

A draft plan has been prepared to guide investment in the network of public reserves at Foxton Beach. The plan supports the commitment made by the Board, and ratified by the Council, to invest \$1m from the Foxton Beach Freeholding Account in improvements to local reserves over a 10 year period. The draft plan has been prepared solely via input and ideas from the Foxton Beach community.

It is proposed that the draft plan be shared with the community to check that it accurately captures the issues, ideas and aspirations raised during its development. This will also provide an opportunity for additional ideas to be added.

The draft plan presents 50+ actions to be undertaken in the reserves over 10 years. The actions have been prioritised, based upon significance of the reserve, alignment with the purpose and identity of the reserve and degree of impact. On this basis it is proposed that the first actions to be undertaken focus on improvements and additions to Holben Reserve.

The Foxton Beach community is encouraged to review the Investment Plan and provide feedback on both the actions and the priority rankings proposed. To do so, the draft Investment Plan will be available on Council's website from later this month through to mid-January. It will be promoted via a range of communication measures and everyone is encouraged to contribute their comments and ideas.

#### 3.4 <u>Meeting Frequency & Commencement Time</u>

It is timely for Board Members to consider the frequency and commencement time of Community Board meetings. For the past triennium the Board has met monthly; for the previous triennium it met six weekly. Traditionally meetings have commenced at 6.30 pm. Is that time still appropriate? The Board's direction is sought.
